1 Town Hall Square & Town Hall
Raekoja plats 1
www.tallinn.ee/raekoda
The historic square at the heart of Old Town and the best-preserved Gothic town hall in Northern Europe.

2 Town Hall Pharmacy
Raekoja plats 11
Europe's longest-running pharmacy, dating to 1422.

3 St. Olav's Church
Lai 50 • www.oleviste.ee
This towering, 13th-century church was once the tallest building in the world. In spring and summer daring visitors can climb up for an amazing view.

4 Toompea Castle and Pikk Hermann
Lossi plats 1
The seat of power in Estonia throughout its history and the castle's famous tower.

5 Cathedral of Saint Mary the Virgin
Toom-Kooli 6

The Dome Church, Estonia's main Lutheran church, once served Tallinn's nobles and still displays their coats of arms.

6 Danish King's Garden
Lühike jalg 9A
A small park that's the legendary birthplace of Denmark's flag.

7 Alexander Nevsky Cathedral
Lossi plats 10

Tallinn's stunning, Russian Orthodox cathedral, built in 1900.

8 Kanut Guild Hall

This hall with a Tudor facade served a guild of skilled craftsmen from various trades.

9 Estonian Handicraft House

The largest selection of handicrafts by master craftsmen from all over Estonia.

10 House of the Brotherhood of Black Heads

Tallinn's most ornate guild hall, with Renaissance facade and spectacular doorway.

11 Holy Spirit Church

A 14th-century church with elaborate painted clock and unique, carved wood interior.

12 Dominican Monastery Claustrium

The remaining inner chambers of St. Catherine's Monastery, established 1246.

13 Epping Tower
Laboratooriumi 31

A renovated, 15th-century tower with displays on Tallinn's fortifications, Medieval weapons and armour.

14 Adamson-Eric Museum

Works by the venerated Estonian artist Adamson-Eric (1902–1968).

15 Dominican Monastery

The inner courtyard and passageways of St. Catherine's Monastery, established 1246.

16 Estonian Museum of Natural History

Taxidermed animals and other displays on the nation's flora and fauna.

17 Estonian Health Care Museum

A school-oriented museum showing insights into health and physiology.

18 Estonian History Museum – Great Guild Hall

The nation's history from ancient times to the end of the 18th century.

Extensive displays on Estonia's sea-faring history, housed in the historic Fat Margaret's cannon tower.

20 Estonian Museum of Applied Art and Design

Works in glass, ceramics, textile, leather, metalwork and jewellery.

21 Estonian Theatre and Music Museum

Antique instruments and hand-cranked, 19th-century music machines.

22 Kiek in de Kōk and Bastion Tunnels
Komandandi tee 2

This huge 15th-century tower is a museum of the town's fortifications and serves as the entrance to the hidden tunnels that run under Toompea hill.

23 Puppet Theatre Museum NUKU

The interactive NUKU centre and museum consists principally of theatre puppets.

24 Niguliste Museum

The 13th-century church houses a museum dedicated to church art, displaying Medieval altarpieces and Tallinn's most famous painting, Bernt Notke's *Danse Macabre*.

25 Tallinn City Museum
Vene 17

A modern and well-presented chronicle of Tallinn history.

26 Town Prison – Museum of Photography

The history of photography in Estonia, housed in the Town Council's former prison.

27 Viewing Platforms
The Kohtu Street and Pakkuli view platforms, give sweeping views of Old Town's rooftops, towers and beyond.

31 Solaris Centre and Nokia Concert Hall

32 Freedom Square and AHHAA Science Centre

Tallinn's showcase square and the kid-friendly AHHAA interactive science centre.

33 Museum of Occupations
Toompea 8 • www.okupatsioon.ee
Dedicated to the 1940–1991 time period when Estonia suffered German and Soviet occupations.

34 St. John's Almshouse
On the breakthrough of Tartu Road near the Radisson Hotel.

Exhibit built over the ruins of a historic almshouse, which was active from 1237 until the late-1960s.

35 Children's Museum

Hundreds of dolls, teddy bears and other toys.

36 Museum Ships of the Estonian Maritime Museum

A Tale of Two Tallinns

Charmingly Medieval or amazingly modern? Figuring out which describes Tallinn better would be a tough job. On one hand, the city's pride and joy is its historic Old Town, an enchanting neighbourhood of centuries—old streets, houses, towers and squares that looks like it was torn right from the pages of a storybook. On the other hand, threaded through that same Old Town and its environs are the cutting-edge restaurants, cafés and clubs that give Tallinn its energy and buzz. Visitors are often amazed by the newness of the place: the gleaming shops, the stylish interiors, the plush hotels. There are also the high-tech solutions that go hand-in-hand with Tallinn life, like free, wireless Internet available practically everywhere and the common practice of paying for parking by mobile phone. This is, after all, the country that invented Skype.

Call it old, new, or some kind of hybrid, Tallinn is an ideal city break destination. For one, it's a highly compact city, most of which can easily be explored on foot without the need for taxis or buses. Most of the best opportunities for sightseeing, cultural events, dining, shopping, and nightlife are conveniently massed in city centre. And there's plenty to do here. Anyone coming here for a real break should know that Tallinn is also a great place to do very little: take a quiet stroll through a park, relax in a health spa or—if the weather cooperates—sit on a beach.

Whatever your agenda, whichever of the Tallinns you need—the romantic, Medieval Tallinn or the trendy, high-tech one—the doors are open. Just take your pick and head on in!



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
